RABBINICAL REFLECTIONS

Passover 5784/2024

Friends:

Each Pesach, we gather for sumptuous Seder meals with friends, family, and loved ones. We set a beautiful Holiday table and celebrate our freedom. We



drink four cups of wine... and we indulge! We shower praise upon young Seder participants as they sing the Four Questions and search for the Afikomen – in anticipation of a grateful gift or reward.

Of course, we taste the Matzah. "Ha Lachma Anya," we recite from the Haggadah: "This is the bread of affliction... the bread of suffering. The flat, tasteless, dry bread our ancestors ate when we were held as slaves in Egypt. The simple Matzah seems out of place in the company of the rich dishes and flowing wine of the Seder.

This year, however, we eat the "Bread of Affliction" and we hear its historic message. The October 7 attacks on Israel afflict our souls... they weigh on us, especially as we prepare – as we must – to celebrate and feast. Over a hundred men, women, elders and infants are still held hostage in Gaza. Their captivity on this Festival of Freedom is an unbearable, intolerable affliction. We pray with heavy hearts – but with fervor – echoing the words of "Ha Lachma Anya" – Ha-Shata Avdei, L'Shanah Ha-Ba'ah B'nei Chorin: This year they are held hostage. May they be released and returned to their families and their homes and their lives in the coming days... so that next year they can celebrate Pesach in the freedom that beloved festival exemplifies. Then, we, too, will taste the "Bread of Affliction" as it is meant to be tasted: as a remembrance of historical significance – in dramatic contrast to the abundant blessings of freedom we enjoy today.

"Ha-Shata Hacha, L'Shanah Ha-Ba'ah B'Ara D'Yisrael." This year... this is where we are. Next year, in the Land... in the State of Israel, may there be reason only for celebration and feasting and rejoicing... in the cherished company of those who have now spent over six months as hostages. This year, their suffering brings a doleful presence to our Seders. Next Year – once again – may we be able to raise our glasses and – with full and grateful hearts – drink to the blessing and triumph of freedom.

Ingredients

- 5 Fuji apples (peeled and chopped)
- 1/2 cup raisins
- 1/2 cup pitted date (coarsely chopped)
- 2 cups English walnuts (chopped)
- 1/2 cup red wine (Shiraz cabernet)
- 1/3 cup honey
- 2 tbsps brown sugar
- 1 tbsp cinnamon

Directions: Preheat oven to 300 degrees. Toast walnuts for 5-7 minutes until fragrant; be careful not to burn. Allow walnuts to cool for about 10 minutes on paper towels. Combine all ingredients in a large mixing bowl and mix well, adding a little more wine if necessary. Pour off any excess liquid. Store in refrigerator. Serve cold or at room temperature.

SELLING YOUR CHAMETZ

Since it is prohibited for Jews to own or possess chametz on Passover, any chametz not consumed, burned, or otherwise disposed of prior to Passover must be sold to a non-Jew, who will own it during Pesach. In order to insure compliance with the details of the law, we appoint a rabbi as our agent for the sale so that it may be carried out properly. The sale of chametz takes effect on Monday morning, April 22, 2024 by 9:00 am and is bought back on the evening after Pesach ends on Tuesday, April 30, 2024 after 8:30 pm. A representative of each household should contact Rabbi Prouser to authorize the sale of the chametz in their family's possession. Please fill out the form below and return to Rabbi Prouser at the temple office.
