RABBINICAL REFLECTIONS

Friends:

Media outlets around the world reported on an unfortunate incident that transpired just recently at the Hecht Museum in Haifa, Israel. A young boy,



touring the museum with his family, momentarily got away from his parents, and grew a bit too "handsy" with an archeological exhibit. He accidentally knocked over — and shattered — a large, heretofore fully intact, 3,500-year-old, Bronze Age ceramic jar. The artifact pre-dated King David himself!

The 4-year-old's shocked and abashed father explained that his son – quite true to form – had been curious about what might be inside the ancient container... and (lacking sufficient physical stature) tipped the exhibit to peek inside! Any further parental responses or disciplinary actions were not reported by the news!

The Museum – which has on previous occasions responded harshly to malicious vandalism and proceeded with criminal charges – acted decisively. Understanding that the innocent (if perhaps mischievous) child meant no harm, the museum pledged to repair the damage... to restore the jar to its rightful place on public display... and to continue its policy of unobstructed exhibits. Most significantly, curators invited the 4-year-old and his family to return to the museum, to tour once again, and to see the jar returned (almost) to its former glory!

What an outstanding model for this season of forgiveness, understanding, repentance, and atonement!

During the High Holy Days, we acknowledge that we, too, have been less than totally mindful and attentive to those whom we most love... those who are our primary responsibilities. We ask ourselves if we have truly done our best, our utmost for future generations.

We acknowledge further that we are heirs to a remarkable and beautiful history: a tradition that has – somehow... miraculously – survived intact over the millennia... and is now in our hands. We concede that we are not always quite so attentive or careful with this treasure as we should be... and we reflect that our neglect comes with a cost.

These High Holy Days are an opportunity to repair any damage we have done... to restore our selves and our souls and our relationships to a more wholesome condition... to pledge a spiritual return to our faith, our community, our congregation, and the best that is within us. We aspire to a child-like (but by no means childish) curiosity... a determination to discover more fully what is inside the ancient tradition that has been preserved for us.

In our own brokenness, we strive to be forgiving and indulgent of others – though they may have wronged us or done us harm. This Holy Season invites us all to Teshuvah – to "Return." May we truly embrace that gracious invitation. May we make the most of the precious opportunity we are about to share... lest the alternative leave us shattered.

Shanah Tovah: My very best wishes for a year of goodness, blessing, peace... and wholeness.


